<p>GENERAL</p> <p>Team Members and Visiting Nursery or SEND group</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nursery or SEND visits are planned in advance and have a dedicated Godstone Farm 'Schools Team' which is managed by the Education Co-ordinator at Godstone Farm. Relevant information is shared with the Visiting Nursery or SEND group prior to their arrival. This includes guidance on appropriate clothing and footwear. The Schools Team are responsible for meeting the Visiting Nursery or SEND group in the car park and escorting them into Godstone Farm. The Visiting Nursery or SEND group must remain with the coach until the School's Team arrive. The Visiting Nursery or SEND group identifies the person in charge and also the Group Leaders (GLs) for each class/group to ensure a clear route for communications. Numbers in the group should be confirmed on arrival. The Schools Team give the Visiting Nursery or SEND group a Welcome Safety Talk when they arrive. Children are welcome to wear hi-vis tabards for the duration of their visit. The Visiting Nursery or SEND group is responsible for managing child-specific needs and should inform the School's Team with any specific requirements prior to arrival. Food for the animals can be ordered prior to arrival. The Farm map and onsite signage shows which animals can be fed. It is also printed on the bags of food. 			
<p>MOVING VEHICLES IN THE CAR PARK</p> <p>Team Members and Visiting Nursery or SEND group</p> <p>Injury from being run over by car or coach.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Coach Park is separated from the main car park with a strict 5mph speed limit. It is positioned next to the entrance to restrict how far the children have to walk in the car park. The children are instructed to line up next to the coach and not venture into the car park. The person in charge should ensure the driver follows instructions from the Schools Team on arrival. The GLs are responsible for supervising the children on and off coach. The GLs should ensure that children stay together within their groups until safely in the Farm. Drivers should inform Godstone Farm if they are going to stay or leave the site. Where possible fences are designed to stop children climbing and lots of gates on animal pens have solid or mesh bottoms to prevent climbing. ALLERGIES Visiting Nursery or SEND group Risk of allergic reaction from touching animals, animal feed, straw, nuts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Visiting Nursery or SEND group should inform Godstone Farm prior to arrival if any member of the group has an allergy to any of the known allergies and also if there are any allergies that are directly related to animals, animal feed, straw and nuts. The Visiting Nursery or SEND group should have a conversation with Godstone Farm prior to arrival if there is a child with a <u>severe</u> allergy to ascertain the measures that need to be taken. In rare cases it might be agreed that the child should not attend the trip. Appropriate child-specific remedies should be with the GLs for the duration of the visit in case of an allergic reaction with knowledge on how to use it. The GLs must ensure any children that have allergies are removed from specific environments if at risk. GLs should not allow children to eat animal feed. (Note the animal feed ingredients are listed at the end of this Risk Assessment.) GLs should ensure they know the guidelines about allergic reactions and what to do if someone has an allergic reaction. 	1	3	LOW

The Visiting Nursery or SEND group should come prepared with the correct clothing, footwear and sun protection however, sun hats, sun cream and ponchos are sold in the Gift Shop GLs to ensure children are using sun cream/hats throughout the day on hot sunny days. First Aid is available if required. Water bottles can be refilled when required. 	1	1	LOW
CHILD PROTECTION Children, Vulnerable Adults and Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Visiting Nursery or SEND group is expected to follow their own guidelines in relation to Child Protection and Safeguarding. They should ensure that children are always accompanied by a member of the school. Godstone Farm Staff will not put themselves in a 1:1 situation with a child under any circumstances. Whilst on site, children from a Visiting Nursery or SEND group remain in the primary care of the Nursery or SEND group. Godstone Farm Staff are recruited according to strict employment protocols. The Education Coordinator and the Events Co-ordinator are DBS checked along with the Management of Godstone Farm however not all of the School's Teams members are as they aren't ever left with children in a 1:1 situation. 	1	1	LOW

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LOST CHILDREN Children By lack of supervision whilst lost, leading to injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is the responsibility of the Visiting Nursery or SEND group to adhere to the correct ratios for supervising children of specific ages. During the Welcome Safety Talk, the Lost Child Policy will be covered and children will be told what to do should they become lost/separated. GLs to have list of groupings and adequate procedures on regular roll calls. The School's Team will also encourage headcounts throughout the visit. GLs to count pupils onto the coach and then a different member of staff to count again whilst they are seated on the coach before setting off to ensure all children are accounted for. 	1	2	LOW
ANIMALS Team Members and Visiting Nursery or SEND group Risk of injury from being bitten, kicked or scratched	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Welcome Safety Talk covers how to treat the animals. During these sessions the GLs must ensure children follow instructions given by Staff. Staff demonstrate the correct way to stroke each animal and emphasise the importance of being gentle. Children who are unsure are given space to watch activities from a distance. Animals are selected for their docility and any that show signs of aggression are not accessible to children in line with our standard procedures. Specific animals that should not be touched are double fenced and gated. Areas are well signposted to warn that some animals may bite. Animals that can be fed have signs next to them saying 'Feed me'. First aid is available should it be required. Staff will remind visitors to wash their hands but the GLs must ensure this happens - especially before eating and drinking. Please note that wet wipes and gels are not sufficient in protecting you from transferable diseases. They do not work. There is signage throughout the farm reminding people to hand wash and how to do it properly. The Animal Interactions and Reptile area is locked when Staff are not present to ensure visitors can't access animals without supervision. 	2	1	LOW

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<p>ANIMALS</p> <p>Visiting Nursery or SEND group Risk of illness from transferable diseases such as E-Coli</p> <p>By hand mouth contact after touching faeces</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Competent and trained staff advise children on hand washing, not putting fingers in their mouths or around their faces and not eating in animal areas at the Welcome Safety Talk. There are 'Look and See' areas (no animal contact) and Look and Touch areas (not recommended for young children who suck fingers unless with 1-to-1 supervision). Any animal showing signs of being unwell are quickly moved into isolation. Staff will remind the Visiting Nursery or SEND group to wash their hands following any handling with anti-bacterial soap. Facilities are located at exits to all animal close contact areas. Hand washing facilities with anti-bacterial soap are located at regular intervals around the Farm and are well sign posted in how to wash hands properly to prevent transferable diseases. Adequate signs around the farm remind people to wash their hands and not to eat in animal areas. Designated eating areas are provided away from animals and indicated with adequate signage. Staff check hand washing facilities are clean, stocked and records kept in line with standard procedures. High levels of cleanliness around animal areas especially animal contact areas. GLs must ensure that children wash their hands with soap and water after handling the animals and especially before eating and drinking. Please note that wet wipes and gels are not sufficient in protecting you from transferable diseases. They do not work. GLs ensure that food or drink is eaten only in the designated eating areas. The Visiting School will be allocated their own picnic area for them to store their belongings (at their own risk) and have their lunch. No other school is given access to this space. All areas are cleaned prior to arrival and at the end of the day. This includes picking up food and emptying bins. GLs to ensure that they wash their own hands before eating and drinking and only eat and drink in the designated areas. Teachers and adults that attend the Farm on a school visit are dissuaded from smoking or vaping. There are designated areas and hands must be washed thoroughly. 	1	3	LOW

The GLs must ensure that children wash their hands with anti-bacterial soap after handling the animals and especially before eating and drinking.
