GENERAL Team Members and Visiting School	 School visits are planned in advance and have a dedicated Godstone Farm 'Schools Team' which is managed by the Education Co-ordinator at Godstone Farm. Relevant information is shared with the Visiting School prior to their arrival. This includes guidance on appropriate clothing and footwear. The Schools Team are responsible for meeting the Visiting School in the car park and escorting them into Godstone Farm. The Visiting School must remain with the coach until the School's Team arrive. The Visiting School identifies the person in charge and also the Group Leaders (GLs) for each class/group to ensure a clear route for communications. Godstone Farm have a School Group Staff Led (SGSL) approach to ensure a successful, informative and safe visit. Numbers in the group should be confirmed on arrival. The Schools Team give the Visiting School a Welcome Safety Talk when they arrive. Children are welcome to wear hi-vis tabards for the duration of their visit. The Visiting School is responsible for managing child-specific needs and should inform the School's Team with any specific requirements prior to arrival. Food for the animals can be ordered prior to arrival. The Farm map and onsite signage shows which animals can be fed. It is also printed on the bags of food. 			
MOVING VEHICLES IN THE CAR PARK Team Members and Visiting School Injury from being run over by car or coach.	 The Coach Park is separated from the main car park with a strict 5mph speed limit. It is positioned next to the entrance to restrict how far the children have to walk in the car park. The children are instructed to line up next to the coach and not venture into the car park. The person in charge should ensure the driver follows instructions from the Schools Team on arrival. The GLs are responsible for supervising the children on and off coach. In rare cases it might be agreed that the child should not attend the trip. The GLs must ensure any children that have allergies are removed from specific environments if at risk. GLs should not allow children to eat animal feed. Animals are selected for their docility and any that show signs of aggression are not accessible to children in line with our standard procedures. Specific animals that should not be touched are double fenced and gated. Areas are well signposted to warn that some animals may bite. Animals that can be fed have signs next to them saying 'Feed me'. This is a SGSL visit which provides a further level of care. First aid is available should it be required. Staff will remind visitors to wash their hands but the GLs must ensure this happens - especially before eating and drinking.
